ORDER REGARDING EX PARTE
APPLICATION FOR TEMPORARY
RESTRAINING ORDER AND ORDER TO
SHOW CAUSE

Petitioner Ramona Mayon filed this action on November 25, 2020, and appeared *ex parte* on Monday, November 30, 2020. Petitioner alleges that on November 18, 2020, the City and County of San Francisco removed a homeless encampment located at Balboa Street and the Great Highway without providing its residents 24 hours advance written notice of its intent to do so, and without providing written notice to residents that any personal property seized when the encampment was removed would be stored for at least 90 days, both as required by San Francisco Police Code section 169. Petitioner also alleges that the City's action was inconsistent with the "Interim Guidance for

Safe Sleeping for Unsheltered Persons Experiencing Homelessness to Reduce the Risk of COVID-19" issued by the San Francisco Department of Public Health on May 19, 2020, which states, "Per CDC guidance, if individual housing options are not available, allow people who are living unsheltered or in encampments to remain where they are." Petitioner also alleges that the City has not complied with the provision of the Interim Guidance document which states that individuals in encampments "must have access" to services and hygiene supplies including toilets, sinks or handwashing stations, showers, garbage, drinking water, meals, cloth face coverings or face masks, and other supplies. Petitioner seeks a temporary restraining order enjoining the City from clearing homeless encampments until the pandemic subsides and existing shelter-in-place orders are lifted, and mandating that the City provide the sanitation supplies referred to in the Interim Guidance.

The Court hereby orders as follows:

- 1. The Court will hold a hearing on Petitioner's application on Wednesday, December 2, 2020 at 1:30 p.m. The hearing will be held by videoconference (Zoom). In order to appear by videoconference, the parties and counsel should follow these instructions: go to the court's website at <u>sfsuperiorcourt.org</u> under "Online Services," navigate to "Tentative Rulings," and click on the link labeled "Law & Motion Department 302 Daily at 9:30 a.m.," or dial the corresponding phone number.
- 2. The City shall e-file and e-serve any opposition to Petitioner's application no later than 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 1, 2020, and shall also email copies of the e-filed papers to <a href="mailto:contestdept302tr@sftc.org">contestdept302tr@sftc.org</a>.
